Dear Mr. Pulliam:-

I have recently received an inquiry from a lady in California who is endeavoring to join the Society of Colonial Dames, and has to submit, as you probably know, as complete a pedigree as she can possibly obtain. She was a Miss Garnett and descends from William Garnett (1777-1852) and his wife Lucy Shipp (1775-1860) who resided in Kentucky but who were married in 1793 in Caroline County, Virginia. This William Garnett was a son of Thomas Garnett and his wife Susanna, thought to have been ~~either~~ Susanna Pulliam ~~or~~ ~~xxxxxx~~ daughter of Thomas and Winifred (Holladay) Pulliam.

I saw your name in "The Virginia Churchman" for October- (I am a vestryman of St. James Church, Leesburg) and am taking the liberty of writing to you hoping you may have been interested in the early members of the Pulliam family and can throw some light on the above. There were a number of Thomas Garnetts in Essex, Caroline, Spotsylvania, Culpeper, etc. and the Thomas Garnett with whom I am familiar (but not descended) is indicated as having married Susannah Andrews. Most of the Garnett family in Culpeper descend from Anthony Garnett and their old place was called "Horse Shoe", in the neighborhood of the home of the late Mr. Stettinius.
