

## Meeting at Hospitality Hse.

tation Wash. Blvd. may be  
depressed in vicinity of Clar-  
endon Circle. Mr. McMullen  
asked what is acquisition  
cost. All land in area  
has been assessed. The Com-  
mittee is assuming private  
development. ~~What~~ 8 acres of  
parking & 6 acres of sidewalk.  
A mix of residential, Apts.  
offices, business, 6 acres of  
offices. Mr. Jones then spoke.  
One main problem has been  
the traffic. A Public Land  
Assembly has been suggested  
by Mr. Murney. The advent  
of metro has made it  
necessary to take a new look  
at Clarendon.
