Dear Sir

Yours of the 1st inst has been rec^d.
I regret very much the difficulties You have
encountered, in relation to Your ~~very~~ fee
for John F. Singleton, I have myself
although some what Young in the
practice experienced similar bad
treatment, then should be no difficulty
about the matter, and if I can be of
any service to You, I will cheerfully
give You my aid. On Yesterday I
saw my brother of the firm of Huff-
man & Camden and conversed
with him about the business, he
says that Singleton's assignment
was only intended to secure to the
firm of H. & C. \$1000 of which (I
think) they have rec^d \$900. and when
they receive \$100 more the balance
will be for the benefit of Mr. Singleton,
and that he is willing and anxious
that You should have a full
compensation for Your services

He also informed me that he had seen Mr. Singleton on the subject who stated that if You had not been paid that You must be, that he supposed You had been paid by Mr. Byrne that at one time he Singleton ate with Mr. Byrne for You \$150. My brother has no objections for the small mention about which You write to lie over until the matter can be arranged, he was on his way to the Bedford Springs and promised to write to You soon.

I shall be at Singleton's the first of August next and will see him on the subject, I presume if Singleton would give a word that You was entitled to \$150 for Your services in the controversy in relation to the land, that ~~Mr~~ would make You to get Your fee.
