

Pulliam - Notes from letters of Frances Carter Smith.

✓ a Jno. Pulliam who died in Hanover Co 1734

Va. Co. Records Vol 6 p 20

✓ Will of John Pulliam of Hanover Co (formed from New Kent Co 1720) 4 Dec 1734 6 Feb 1735 in which he names 4 sons: William, John, James, Drury & 3 daughters Agnes, Elizabeth, Sarah and wife Agnes.

✓ Patience P. owned land in Hanover 1730.

Patience and Thomas were in Spotsylvania in 1735

✓ John Patience and Thomas might have been younger brothers of William

✓ Children of William P - St. Peter's Register

Wm Pulliam received several grants of land in New Kent Co - See Va. Co. Records Vol 6 p 206

Index to land grants, New Kent Co.

I have often heard my father say that his mother's mother's mother was a Boswell (I had an uncle named Jos. Boswell Carter)

The will of Benj. Holliday, son of Capt Jno - dated 1785 names his son-in-law Jno. Pulliam his executor. Benjamin was the brother of Joseph Holliday who was the grandfather of Gen. Walter Holliday "Gen. Holliday's father was a 1st cousin of my great grand mother on the Pulliam side"

Sent me Rev. record of Thos. P. I have another record which shows that he was in Capt. Ammestead White's Co and was at the "Siege of York".

✓ On p 215, Vol 31, Vth Historical Mag. There is a Rent Roll of the lands of her Mag^{ty} in the Parish of St Peter and St Paul, Anno 1704" which is the Quit Rent Roll of New Kent Co, Vth and on page 225, the name

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✓ of "William Pulliam [Pulliam]" appears for 575 acres
There were several grants to Wm Pulliam.

The Parish Register gives his children up to 1700
(Thos & Patricia might be his children born later).

✓ I can add Uriah and Pulliam to the children
of Frances P. Hilde. Father remembered only
Holladay and Hemwood. There must have been
another as Uriah and Pulliam Hilde inherited
1/2 each of a certain tract of land.

✓ Thos. P. Jr was one of 10 children. He and his brother
Benjamin went to Chesapeake from Spotsylvania Oct
yrs 1764 + 1770. Benj was a minor in 1764 when
his brother James, who was his guardian died and
Thos. was made guardian. The first Thos. acquired
land in Spotsylvania in 1735
