From Werter to Susan—A University Legacy to Love, Honor, and Cherish

Werter Hobson Hurt Jr., R'49, is from a long line of Spiders. In addition to his wife, other Spider family members included his grandfather, father, two football-playing uncles, sister, brother-in-law, and cousin. Werter originally began college in The Citadel's ROTC in 1942, but completed only one year before joining the war effort as an Air Force pilot. Originally bound for Nadzab, New Guinea, the dropping of the atom bomb sent him instead to Massachusetts and finally back home to Culpeper, Va., for Christmas in 1946.

At the urging of his father, Werter enrolled in the University of Richmond in 1946 to complete the education his father never could, due to his own service in the Great War. On campus, Werter met Susan Dickinson, a Westhampton co-ed from Front Royal,

Va., who was elected May Queen. Susan also elected to become Wert's bride when he proposed with a ring near Milhiser gym.

The newlyweds moved to Culpeper and again Wert's father offered invaluable advice: Leave the family dairy-farming business and become an entrepreneur. Wert and his brother-in-law, A. Gordon Willis Jr., R'43, created the Culpeper Stone Company after buying the local quarry and its contents, much of which paved the original Interstate 95 between Washington, D.C., and Fredericksburg, Va.

Wert and Susan, parents of two and grandparents of four, were married for 52 years until Susan's death in 2002. He recently honored her, their marriage, and their alma mater by naming the Susan Dickinson Hurt Gallery in the new Westhampton Center. Wert's long-held shares of stock made the perfect outright gift while avoiding capital-gain tax. Also in honor of his wife, he has named Westhampton College the beneficiary of a charitable remainder trust. Wert chose to include the University prominently in his philanthropy because he believes he is making an investment that will be stewarded with purpose and intent.

Belair

"Belair" on the Rapidan home of Werter Hobson Hurt and his wife, Janet Stringfellow Hurt, has been the home of four generations bearing the Stringfellow name. The present house was built about 1833 by the first Stringfellow owner, the Rev. Thornton, and was added onto by his great-nephew who was Mrs. Hurt's father, Thornton Stringfellow, in 1888.

An old two-room kitchen outside the yard still standing today dates back to the Hansbrough family's ownership of "Belair", 1815-1833. A homemade crane still works in the big double fireplace in its huge stone chimney, 6 feet in depth by 10 feet in width.

Set on a high hill overlooking the junction of Potato Run and the Rapidan River, "Belair" looks across the river into Orange County and commands a beautiful view of fertile river lands up the valley of the Rapidan with Clark's Mountain in the near foreground and the Blue Ridge in the distance.

Ownership of the land may be traced back to Governor Alexander Spotswood, who patented large tracts on both sides of the Rapidan River in Orange and Culpeper counties. He left 40,000 acres of this land to his grandson, also Alexander Spotswood, who, about the time of the Revolution, sold much or all the property.

The "Belair" estate was sold first to Richard Hackley and William Pannill, who, a few months later, conveyed it to Robert Pollard, a prominent Culpeper County citizen-vestryman of St. Mark's Parish, trustee of the founding of Stevensburg, and Revolutionary soldier.

The Pollards sold the "Belair" and other Rapidan River tract in 1787 to Samuel Coles who also owned land beyond Stevensburg "Cole's Hill" derived its name from his ownership. In 1805 his son Samuel Coles, Jr. sold the land, purchased by his father from Robert Pollard, to Alexander Voss.

From Mr. Voss in 1815, James Hansbrough of "Salubria", purchased "Belair" and the adjoining tracts of "Fox Hall" and Englewood" (now owned by Mrs. John Walker and William R. Walker, respectively) and added them to his extensive holdings around Stevensburg. By deed of gift James conveyed to his son, Joseph Sumner Hansbrough, the "Belair" estate consisting of 700 acres.

The President Arthur's Wife

Joseph S. Hansbrough married Sarah Myers and they were the parents of Lucy Ellen and Frances Elizabeth Hansbrough, who married brothers, Dr. Brodie S. Herndon and William Lewis Herndon, of Fredericksburg. The latter explored the Valley of the Amazon and was styled the "Livingston of South America". When his ship, the Central America, sank off Cape Hatteras, he died a hero's death, and a monument to his memory is located on the campus of the U.S. Naval Academy at

Annapolis. An only daughter of Frances Elizabeth Hansbrough and William Lewis Herndon, who married Chester Alan Arthur, 21st President of the United States.

Joseph Hansbrough built and occupied a house at "Belair", located about a quarter of a mile northeast of the present site and nearer the old entrance which was originally on the Lignum-to-Batna road. The present entrance is on the Batna-to-Raccoon Ford road. The old house was said to have been standing as late as 1870 and its architecture is described by the late John Herndon, as "conforming to the period in which it was built". Mr. Herndon, grandson of Dr. Brodie S. and Lucy Ellen Hansbrough Herndon, is the author of an unpublished history of the Hansbrough family which he placed in the University of Virginia library.

The Rev. Stringfellow purchased "Belair" from Joseph Hansbrough in 1833 and built the old part of the present dwelling which is the two-and-a-half story section with dormer windows at the back. The first floor of this section is a few steps below ground and there is no basement. It has a brick wall some nine feet up from the ground with weatherboarding above.

A noted Bible scholar and preacher, the Rev. Stringfellow was the author of a book in which he sought to show the Christianizing influences of slavery. He preached the organizational sermon of the Stevensburg Baptist Church on October 23, 1833 and was unanimously elected pastor of the church. The land was approximately 1000 acres on the Rapidan River. He owned 60-70 slaves. He justified slavery as a positive good and a form of moral stewardship. In the church, Stevensburg Baptist, the black membership was nearly as large as the white. He was greatly concerned with saving and reforming the slaves who belonged to the church. During the Civil War, the Rev. and Mrs. Stringfellow and their granddaughter were held captive at Belair as federal troops supplied their men with produce from the plantation. On October 5, 1863, all the slaves had fled and he felt that they had been kidnapped by the Yankees. He helped organize the Stevensburg church in 1833 and served as its pastor till 1848. "He was a scholarly man, a preacher of marked ability, and a wise and prudent leader greatly beloved."

Belair remained in the Stringfellow family until Werter Hart and Janet Stringfellow sold it in 1971. The home was demolished in 1980.

He was the youngest of the five sons of his father, Robert, of "Liberty Hill" at Summerduck, Fauquier County. In addition to "Belair," he owned another farm nearer Raccoon Ford which he called "Summerduck". The Rev. Thornton had a brother, Robert, known as "Robert of the Retreat". "The Retreat" was the name of his home near Raccoon Ford.

The Baptist minister had four wives. Only two children-both daughters, Elizabeth and Penelope-lived to maturity.

Elizabeth married C.C. Taliaferro and a daughter of this marriage married a Spindle. To her Rev. Thornton Stringfellow willed "Belair".

Stringfellow (brother of the Rev. Thornton) and his wife Hannah Robinson Moxley, widow. There were no children of this marriage. After the death of Penelope, James Lawrence married his second wife Harriet Ficklin. They became the parents of George Ficklin and Thornton Stringfellow. The latter was the father of Dr. J.L. Stringfellow and Janet S. Hurt, both of Culpeper County; Dr. Charles Stringfellow, U.S. Navy, and Miss Mae Stringfellow, of Charlottesville. The former was the father of Mrs. Landon Gray and Mrs. Marvin Gray, formerly of Culpeper County.

George and Thornton Stringfellow were born at "Summerduck" which their father's first wife Penelope, had inherited from her father. Later, by mutual consent, their father, James L. Stringfellow, and the Spindles, who were living at "Belair", exchanged property. James L. thus got possession of "Belair" where his sons grew to maturity.

Thornton Stringfellow fell heir to the home place and reared his family of six children there. He built on the front part of the house which faces the new entrance to the southwest. After his death his son, Dr. J. L. Stringfellow, purchased the property and sold it to his brother-in-law and sister, Mr. and Mrs. Hurt.

Today the gracious hospitable old home has been modernized; the farm's acreage has been substantially increased and modern scientific farming is done on a large scale on this fertile dairy farm.

There are two large rooms with high ceilings and wide center hall on both floors of the new part of the house; also, a full attic and a fourth floor cupola room with a winding stairway leading to it. From the entrance hall one enters the old part of the house through a door and one step down. Downstairs in this section, there are one large and five or six smaller rooms as well as passageways and back hall; also, an inside and outside stairway, these, with the front stairway, making three flights to the second floor. Upstairs in the old part of the house there are two large rooms, bath, and wide hall. On the third floor there are four small rooms with dormer windows.

The beautiful heavy walnut front entrance door with side lights is duplicated in a second floor door which leads onto an upper porch. Bay windows in each of the four front rooms have inside blinds. Windows on the old section have old fashioned outside blinds. This part of the house is also characterized by its wide floor boards, small mantels and fireplaces, and lower doorways.

Most of the cedar posts used in erecting a picket fence around the spacious lawn in 1888 are still standing and sound today.

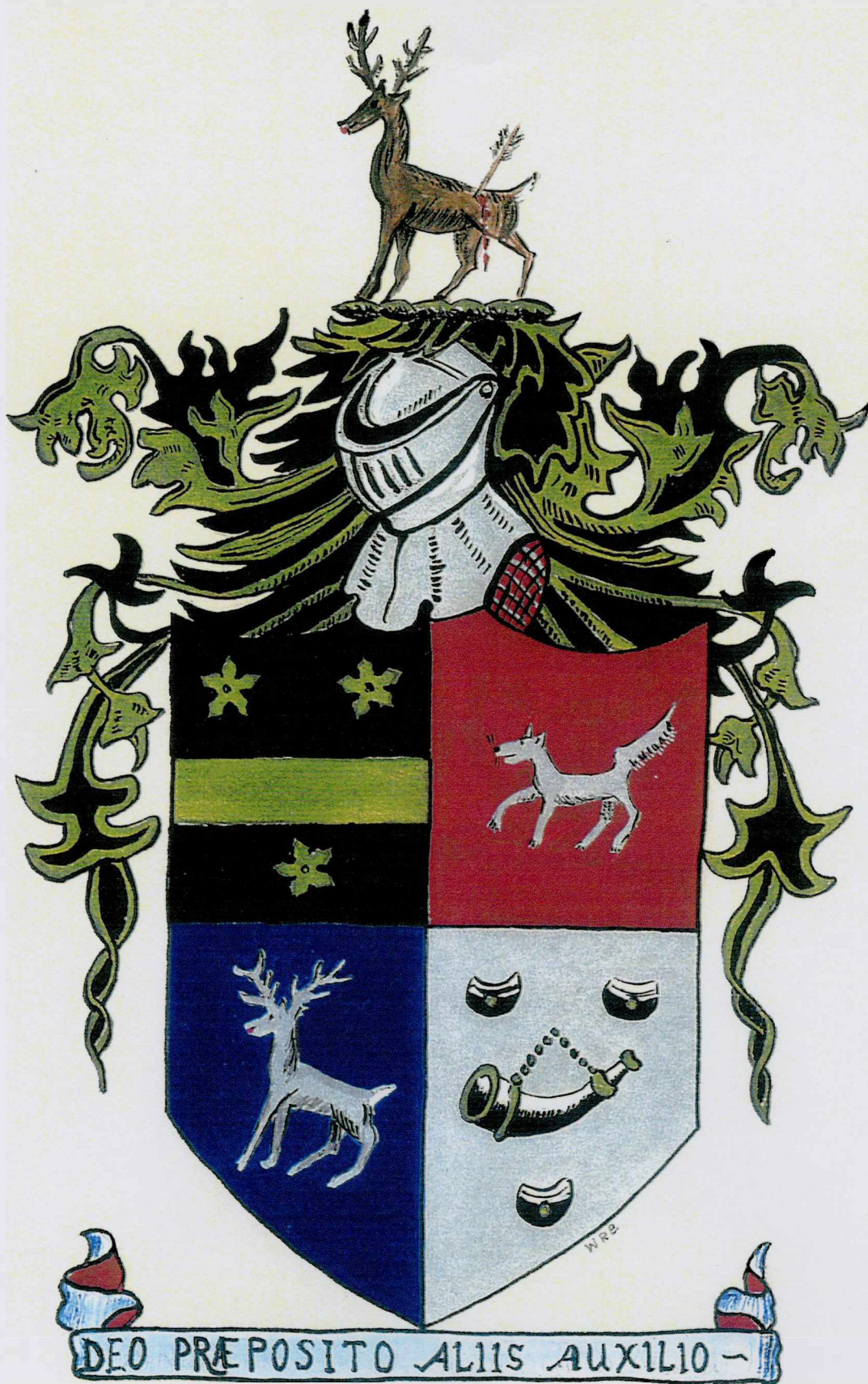

Alderwasley-co. Derby; settled for five generations at Ashborne, at the time of The Visitations of 1611. The present representative is Francis Hurt of Alderwasley, Esqr., late M. P. for the southern division of the county, and High Sheriff in 1814, great great grandson of Nicholas Hurt of Casterne, co. Stafford, Esqr., by Elizabeth his wife, sister and co-heir of John Lowe of Alderwasley, esqr.

Arms: Quarterley, first, Sa. a fess between three cinquefoils. Or., for Hurt; second, Gu., a wolf passant, Ar., for Lowe of Alderwasley; third Az., a hart trippant, Ar., for Lowe of Alderwasley; and Denby; fourth Ar., a bugle horn between three crescents, Sa., charged each with a bezant Or., for Fawne of Alderwasley.

Crest: a hart pass. ppr., horned, membered and hurt in haunch with an arrow Or., feathered Ar.

Motto: Mane praedam vesperi spoliolum.

The custom of using a coat of arms may be traced to very early times, as to the standard of the Twelve Tribes of Israel, of the Egyptians and The Roman Eagles. From these times grew the customs of clans and families distinguishing themselves from others by signs and emblems. After awhile it was considered a right of all noblemen to use a coat of arms. No two families are allowed to use the same.

A coat of arms is composed of a shield or escutcheon on which the charges or emblems are depicted, often the charges have some relation to the names or residence of the user. It also often includes the crest, wreath, helmet, lambrequin and motto.

The Crest: is the ornament which surmounts the helmet. Only those families which were of tournament rank were entitled to a crest.

The Wreath: is a skein of silk with a gold or silver cord twisted round it and then placed as a fillet upon the helmet to cover the joining of the crest there.

The Helmet: In as much as everybody during the period of warfare in armour wore a helmet, so everybody who has a shield of arms has the right to some helmet or other. However, often one is not shown. The helmet for Hurt is that of an esquire or gentleman, is of steel, is in profile, and has the visor closed.

The Shield: without the shield there can be neither a coat or arms nor achievement. It is the shield upon which the existence of everything else hangs and depends, and it is the shield which is of first and greatest importance.

The Motto: The College of Arms permits the selection of a motto at the fancy of the grantee and recognizes no ownership or prior claim in any particular motto or forms or words. Unless a motto is selected by the grantee, the patent is issued without one. The motto is "a word, saying, or sentence which gentlemen carry in a scroll under the arms, and sometimes over the Crest." Mottoes may be taken, changed, or relinquished, when and as often as the bearer thinks fit. It is the ONLY thing about the coat of arms which may be changed. It is usually of a religious nature.

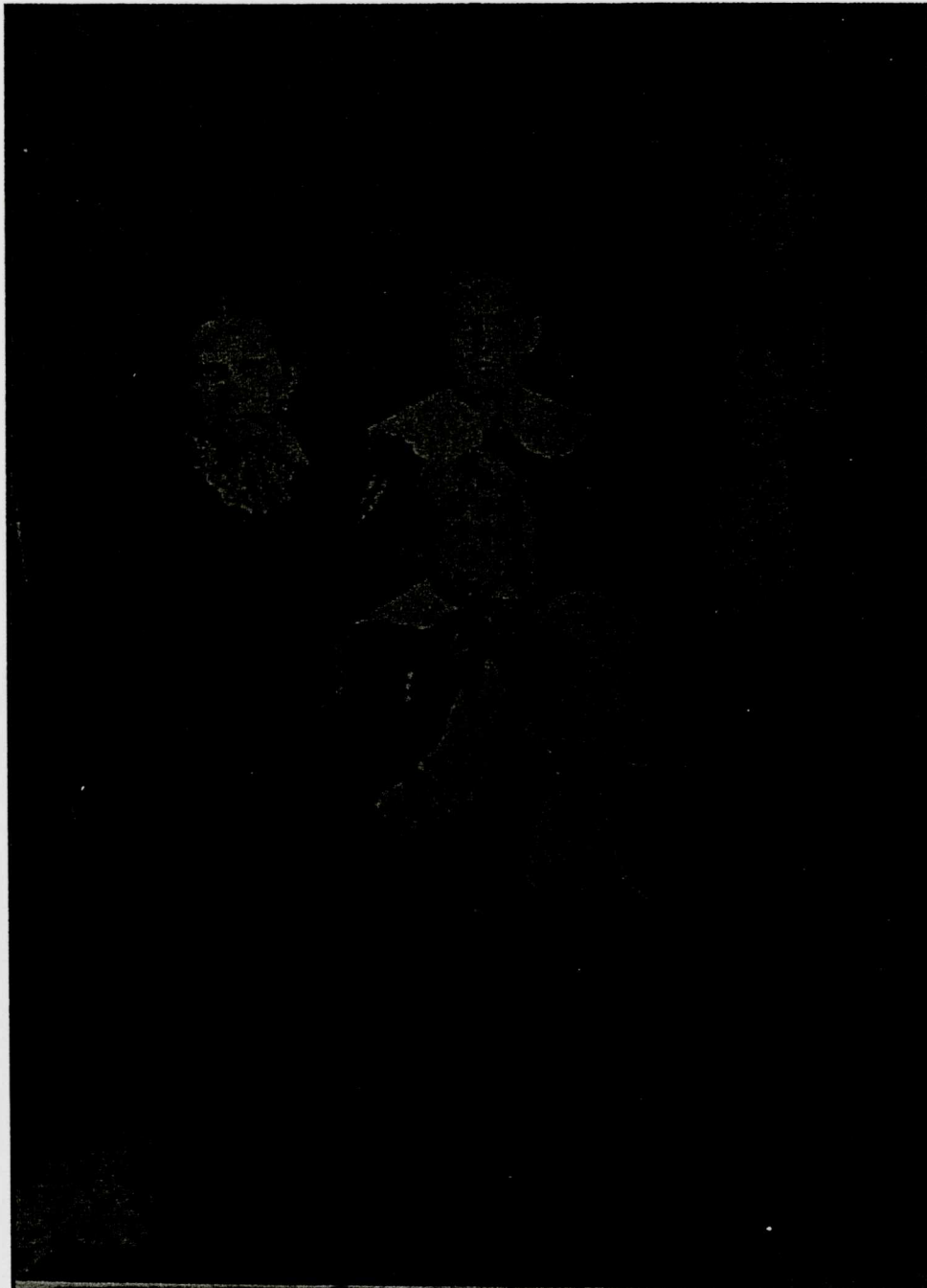

She was greatly loved in the community- and had a burden for the unsaved in the world.

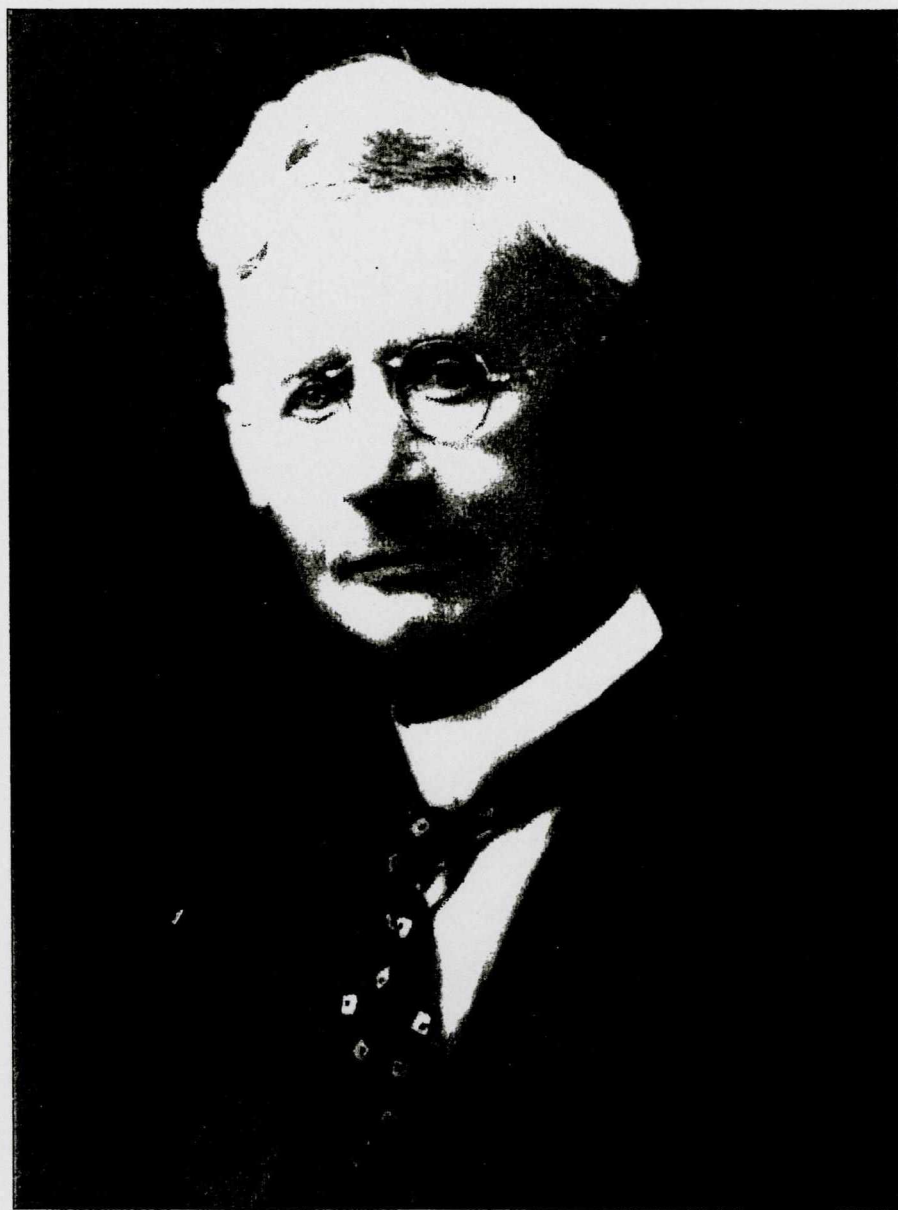

Culpeper County Centenarian Remembers Being Kissed by General Robert E. Lee

A century of living has dimmed the memory and halted the physical activity of Culpeper County's oldest citizen, Mrs. Mary Hobson Hurt, who will pass her one hundredth birthday Friday. However, there still come days when she remembers and talks of things that made vivid impressions upon her in the dim long ago—for instance, the time General Robert E. Lee took her in his arms and kissed her.

It was a day some 92 years ago, shortly after the close of the Civil War, that her mother, Mrs. William Wilson Hobson, saw the carriage of her close neighbor, General Lee, approaching the Hobson home in Powhatan County and bade "Uncle Hannibal" take all the children quickly to the woods back of the house because there would not be time to get them washed and dressed to receive such an illustrious visitor. After the general had graciously thanked Mrs. Hobson for the weekly hamper of food she had sent the Lee family, he called for the children. And when they were brought in to greet Gen. Lee, he took little eight-year-old Mollie Hobson in his arms and kissed her.

This is an incident Mrs. Hurt has recalled with pride all her life and still tells with relish on some of her "clear days". She can also remember her father's leaving home to go to war, his return after being wounded and his hiring a substitute to take his place in the Confederate ranks.

Baptist Minister's Wife

Mrs. Hurt, a Baptist minister's wife for 46 years, will spend her birthday quietly at the home of her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Edwin S. Norman, at Stevensburg, where she has made her home since her husband's death a quarter of a century ago.

Due to her frail health, no formal celebration of the centennial event is planned. However, members of the Stevensburg Woman's Missionary Society have made plans to visit the home taking flowers and a complete birthday dinner for the family. The society, in which Mrs. Hurt was long active, will present in her honor three silver

collection plates, suitably engraved, to Stevensburg Baptist Church, where her husband, the late Rev. George William Hurt, was pastor for nearly 30 years.

Mrs. Hurt's elder daughter, Mrs. Orville Nalle, who has nursed her mother during five years of invalidism following a fall in which she suffered a broken hip, will be present for the occasion; also, a son, Werter Hobson Hurt, who lives in the county. Another son, Dr. George S. Hurt, resides in Roanoke. Mrs. Hurt's youngest son, Dr. W. W. Hurt, died last year. She has 14 grandchildren and 21 great-grandchildren.

If her birthday happens to be one of her good days, she may sing a hymn and offer a prayer. Words of prayer come more readily to her lips, these days, than any other form of expression a happy result of a lifetime habit of prayerful living. Characteristically, her prayers are for self-improvement and that she may not be a burden to others.

Only kind and gentle thoughts penetrate her mind. Manifestations of appreciativeness, unselfishness and consideration for others come naturally, but there is only a occasional glimpse of the old ready wit and humor, originality and forthrightness that up to a year ago delighted her family and friends.

Native of Powhatan

Mrs. Hurt, the former Mary Thomas Hobson, daughter of William W. Hobson, of "Blenheim", Powhatan County, and Arabella Bolling Hobson, a native of Petersburg, was born at "Vernon", home of her parents in Powhatan County, June 28, 1857. After being taught by her mother and private tutors in the home, she completed her education under her aunt, Miss Annie Bolling, who conducted a young ladies' finishing school in Petersburg during and after the Civil War.

In 1886, after an engagement of 10 years, she was married to Mr. Hurt, also of Powhatan, who had just finished his education at the Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, KY., after taking a college degree at Richmond College. It is interesting to note that this couple felt they could not be married until the husband had completed his education and was able to support a wife.

After pastorates in Elizabethtown, KY., Guyton, GA., and Onanock on the Eastern Shore of Virginia, Mr. Hurt accepted a call in Culpeper County, comprising Stevensburg, Lael (at Lignum) and Brandy. The same three churches still form a field served today by the Rev. Jerry L. Holloway.

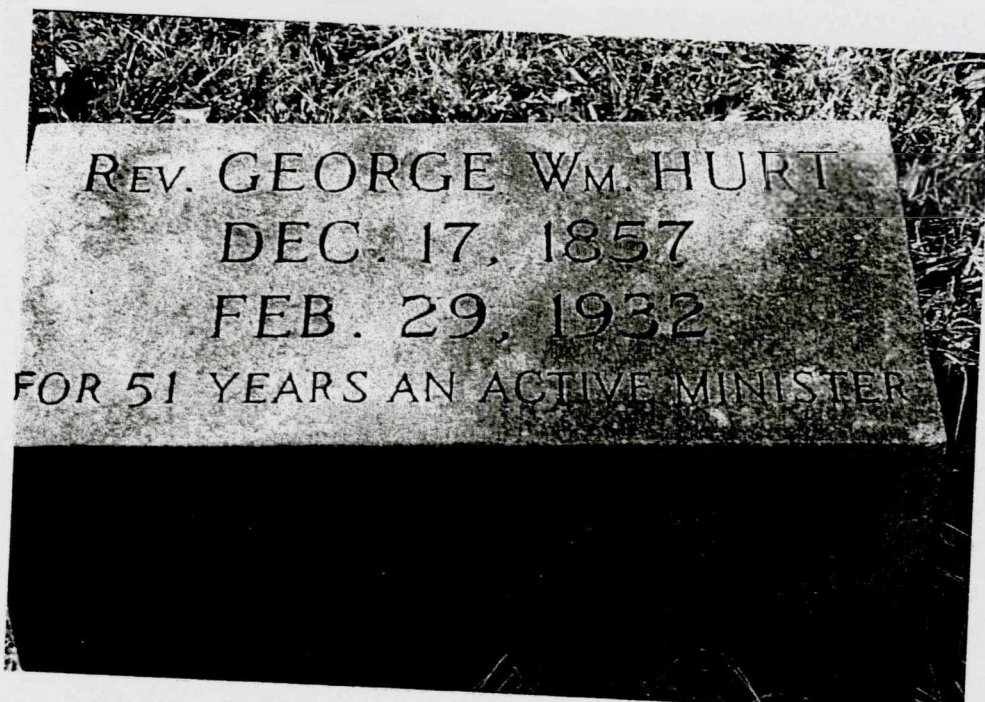
After resigning as pastor at Stevensburg and Lael., Mr. Hurt continued as part-time pastor at Brandy until his death. Mrs. Hurt has resided in the Stevensburg community continuously since coming to the county 55 years ago.

Zeal for Missions

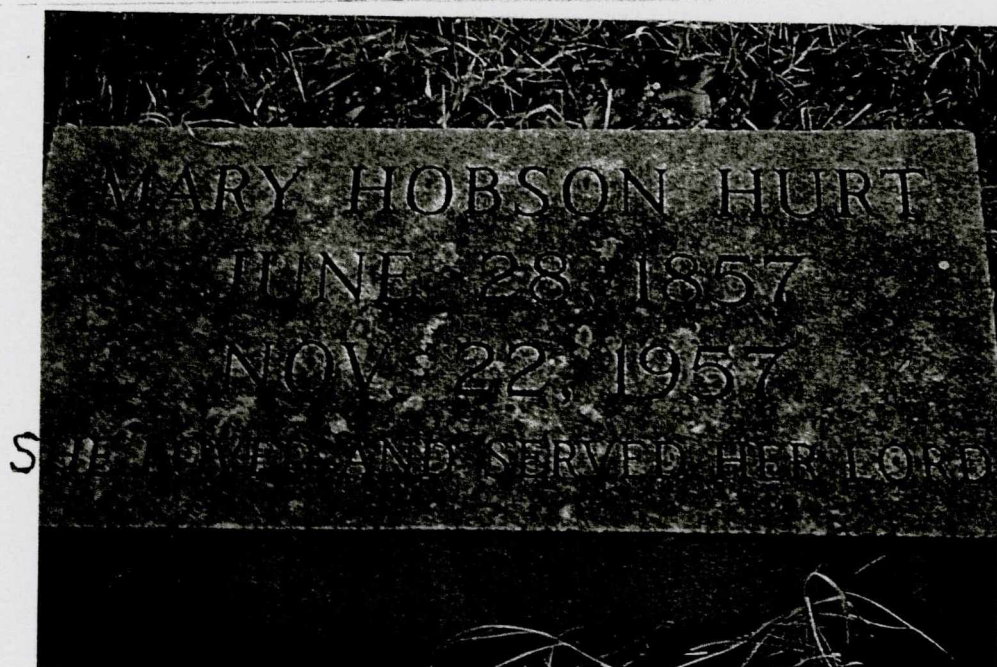
Her interest and activity in all phases of church work continued up until the time of her fall in her 96th year. Her missionary zeal was legendary; and she never missed an opportunity to convert a ton-tither. Trained by her parents in this practice, Mrs. Hurt in her late years counted it a joy to be able to give nearer ninety-ninths than one-tenth of means to missions. For approximately 20 years she supported privately two missionaries in China.

During the more than half a century she has lived in this county, Mrs. Hurt has endeared herself to a large circle of friends who will pay her homage on her hundredth birthday by remembering with gratitude her long useful life. They will recall the remarkable energy, industry, initiative and resourcefulness she applied to many worthwhile tasks, and the optimism, faith and undaunted spirit with which she carried them through to fulfillment. They will delight to recall her gifts of lively conversation and repartee; her qualities of unselfishness and generosity, and her loyalty and devotion to family, friends, church and Christian ideals.

Saturday, October 19, 1912, V.M.I. defeated the University of Virginia, 19 to 0, for their first victory ever in football over Virginia.



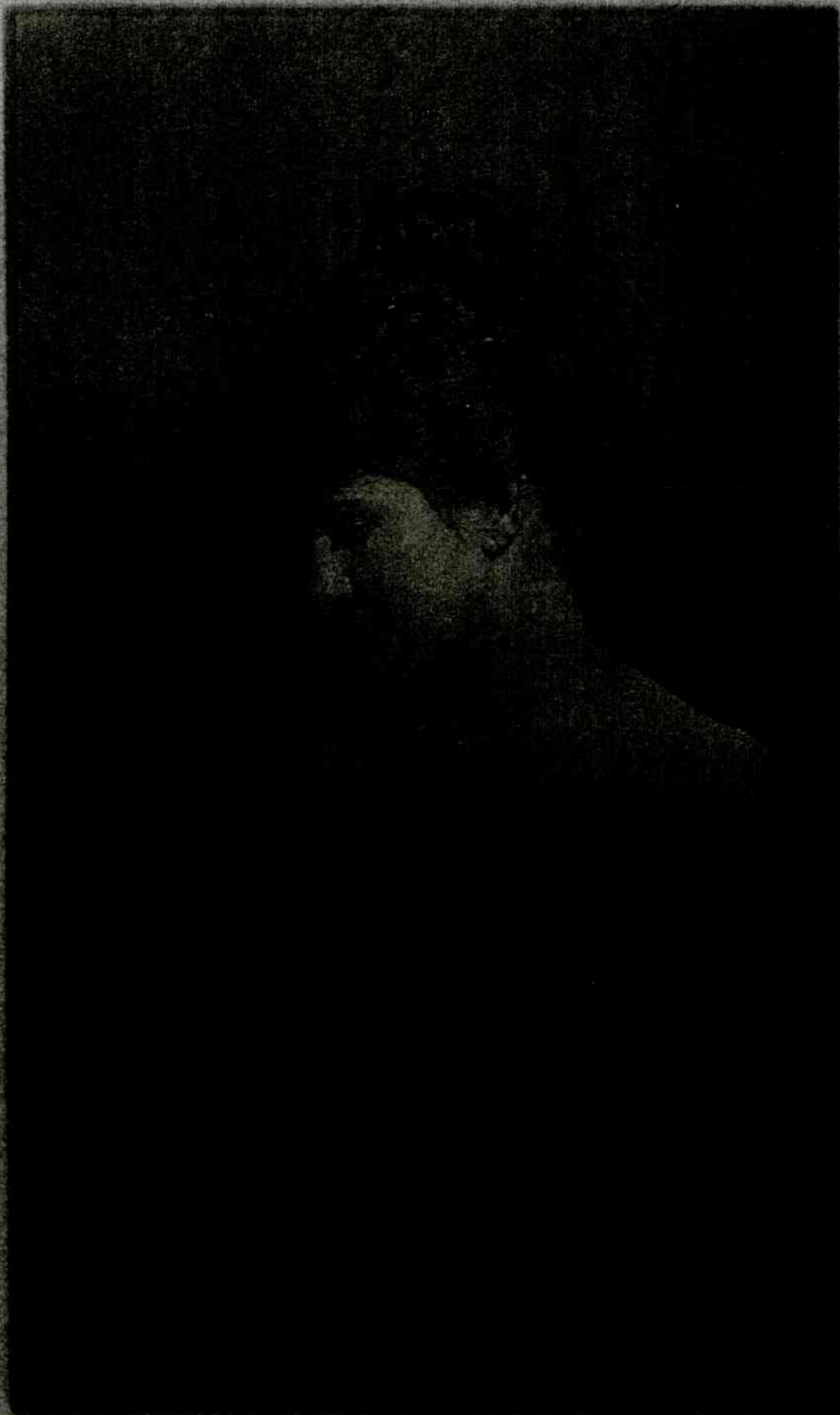

**Werter H. Hurt:
A Good Neighbor**

CULPEPER - A minister's son who says he became the family "black sheep" by being a farmer when his two brothers were both doctors, Werter H. Hurt of Culpeper has nonetheless garnered some unique laurels. Among them are a gerontological center named for him, a handwritten letter from Winston Churchill, and a carefully-stitched sampler which stands as a family tribute.

The sampler, which hangs in Hurt's den in his home on Macoy Avenue, says "If All Else Fails, Ask Grandfather."

In his almost 85 years, this big, genial man has been asked for and has given a lot to people and to organizations, from Virginia Baptist Homes and the Culpeper Rotary Club to his children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

The Hurt Gerontological Center at the Baptist Home here is named for him in recognition of his long interest and financial support for both VBH and research on aging. He was an early member of Rotary, and was its president in 1940-41, and it was as a Rotarian that he got his Churchill letter. The British leader, he recalls, had been "turned out" by his people after years as head of Parliament. The late F.R. (Buddy) Simpson, Rotary secretary, and Hurt decided to write to Churchill to sympathize, saying they didn't feel he had justice.

In return, they received the personal letter, which now resides in a bank vault, treasured for four decades.

Hurt was born in Georgia, although his people were originally from Powhatan in Virginia. His minister father was serving his first pastorate in Georgia, but when Wert was eight, the family came to Culpeper County. The new pastorate which was his father's last, was a three-church field, the congregations at Lignum, Stevensburg and Brandy Station. Young Wert (a family name from his father's side) grew up in Stevensburg, but spent summers on the farm of a family friend, T.B. Jones, at Batna.

He went off to Richmond College, for the liberal education such as a young man generally received. In his third year, 1917, he and some friends talked to an Army recruiting officer, who promised that if they volunteered they would be flying in 90 days. Hurt signed up, and "the closest I ever got to flying was loading crates of airplane parts on railroad cars in Middletown, Pa."

He finally made it to officers training camp in Atlanta, GA., and after 17 months in the Army, was commissioned and then discharged within 10 days of the Armistice. In another 30 days, he was farming.

Reaching home, he had gone to visit his friend Mr. Jones, and the two were driving past a neighboring farm and stopped to talk to the owner. Hurt remembers that Jones told the other man "This boy wants to farm," to have the landowner return "Good--I'll sell him mine." With Jones' help, he was soon established.

Hurt started raising cattle, but in 1930 he went into the dairy business. He operated two dairy farms, and had other land; at one time owning about 2,000 acres.

Setting a young man up to farm now is no mean feat, he feels, with the prices of land and equipment. One grandson, Werter Hurt Willis, is interested in farming. "It's almost impossible for a young man to go into it" now, starting from scratch, according to Hurt.

Always involved in church work Hurt began many years ago to see the need for a home for the elderly. "Old people didn't have anywhere to go," he says. Dr. J.T. Edwards, who was pastor of the Culpeper Baptist Church, and he worked toward establishing a Baptist home here, and though "it was hard going" they collected enough money to put up the first building for the first Virginia Baptist Home. Hurt's 92-year-old sister is now among the residents.

Other needs occurred along the way in the community. During World War I, Hurt founded the frozen food locker, which for many years operated as a cooperative. He and Gordon Willis started Culpeper Stone, for their two sons, each of whom now has a son of his own in the business. Willis, Hurt and the late William J. Smith began the Farmers Cooperative here.

Rotary, which began here in January of 1927, claimed a lot of Hurt's energy. He lists as particular highlights of his time as president the recognition of the local club at the organization's annual convention as the "most improved in attendance for the year." Hurt went to the podium for the silver plaque himself, with considerable pride.

The Churchill letter was another high spot, as was the initiation of the Rotary Good Citizen award during his presidency. A fourth was the establishment of a Boy Scout Lodge in Culpeper, at the end of Scanlon Street, which didn't ever "catch fire."

Hurt is also one of the first members, and remains a member of the Lignum Ruritan Club. He was president of the Chamber of Commerce here at one time.

He was married to the late Janet Stringfellow. They had two sons, Werter Jr., who lives on Macoy Avenue, and Dr. Charles W. Hurt of Charlottesville. Hurt is now married to Star-Exponent columnist Anna Townsend, and has lived on Macoy since 1960. He stills attends the Stevensburg Baptist Church. *He had three daughters. Janet, Mrs. A. Gordon Willis. Betty, Mrs. W. Robert Beasley. Mary, Mrs. Leonard Winslow.*

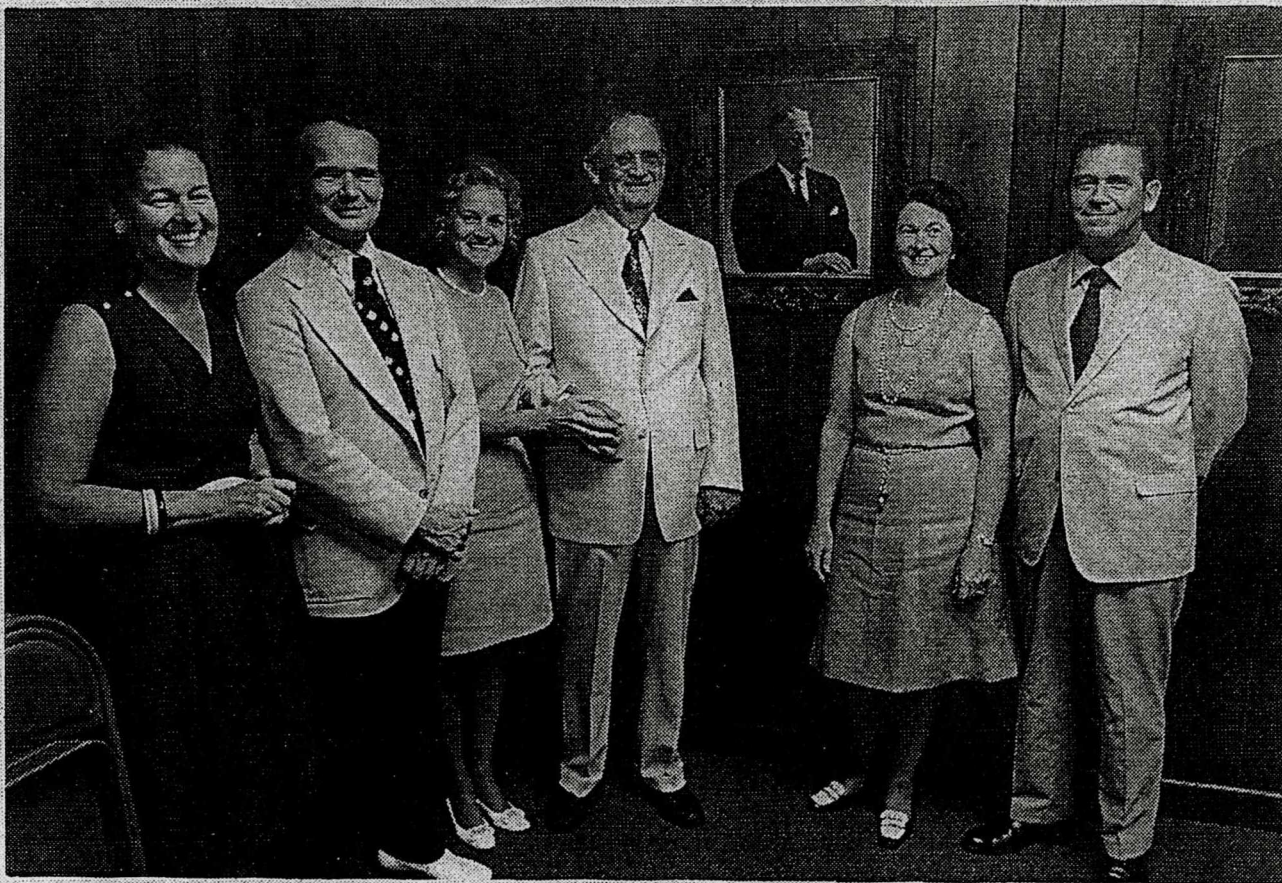
Besides his active interest in The Culpeper National and his able assistance on your board of directors, Mr. Hurt has been an active business man for the past forty years in farming and dairy farming.

Baptist Home in Culpeper Has Endowed Aging Center

CULPEPER-The Hurt Gerontology Center has no state or federal funds in its budget, no matching grants from HEW, no foundation or corporation money to work with.

Yet it may one day be responsible for more significant improvements in the lives of the elderly than all the federal, state and local agencies now on the scene. That's the hope and goal of William L. Howse III, its director.

Sitting easily at his desk, with pictures of his two children on the shelf behind him, Howse talks about the center and the Virginia Baptist Homes like a man who honestly enjoys his work.

The center owes its birth to Werter H. Hurt, a former chairman of the board of the Virginia Baptist Homes. A long time Culpeper businessman, Hurt provided an initial grant of \$100,000 to begin the gerontology center in 1974.



The center is now housed in the administration building at the Virginia Baptist Home near Culpeper and provides housing for more than 200 elderly persons and operates a 600-acre farm.



Within a few short months it will be thirty years since I first met Janet Stringfellow Hurt whose memory we come today to honor. As we come to this moment we come with all the mixed feelings of sadness at the loss of one of God's gracious children, sadness at the separation from one we loved, respected, admired, but more than that, the sense of joy and triumph that the spirit which was hers has now joined the Creator who gave her. Although in these later years, her spirit was not able to express itself because of the frailty of which we are heir, here too her spirit was an example to us.

As I go back through my memories of her, there is one quality which stands out unmistakably clear, and that was her gentle, gracious spirit. This spirit permeated all she did. She was a disciple of Him who came into the world to light the hearts of men and women. Her spirit was as if one were to light a candle in the darkness. It was a blessing!

She was part of that tradition which emphasized noble character, a tradition which we must not lose. She stood in the tradition of the virtuous woman so eloquently expressed in Proverbs 34. Indeed, her worth is far above rubies! In a day and age which seems to have lost many of its moorings, whose anchor is gone, whose rudder wheel is spinning aimlessly, she was part of that tradition which trusted in God and who with Job of old in the midst of adversity such as few are called upon to face, could with courage say "though He slay me, yet will I trust Him."

She has left a legacy in this community among the lives touched by her. She has left a legacy within the church congregation where her interest expressed itself in so many ways. She lovingly and tenderly worked with the smaller children and felt a responsibility for those who did not come to church but ought to. How she wished she could arouse their interest, motivate them in some way, or challenge them to share her concern.

She has left a legacy in her family and though them and others, her influence will roll on to the shores of eternity.

The secret of the life was trust and faith. We were not made to see the end from the beginning. We were made to live one day at a time, to rely upon the promises of God. How often do we sacrifice peace of mind and serenity of heart because we run ahead of God and borrow tomorrow's troubles today. Just as God provides our daily bread, so does He provide our daily strength.

We shall miss Janet Stringfellow Hurt. She was one of God's choice creations, but let us be strengthened by the example of her life and faith.

One of her favorite poems was Tennyson's "Crossing the Bar."

Sunset and evening star,
And one clear call for me!
And may there be no moaning of the bar,
When I put out to sea.
But such a tide as moving seems asleep,
Too full for sound and foam,
When that which drew from out the boundless deep
Turns again home.

Twilight and evening bell,
And after that the dark!
And may there be no sadness of farewell,
When I embark.

For tho' from out over bourne of Time and Place
The flood may bear me far,
I hope to see my Pilot face to face
When I have crossed the bar.

It is our faith that in this moment, Janet Stringfellow Hurt is with the Pilot of her life.

I write this letter to each one of you today because I share with you the sorrow of the earthly loss of your father. When your mother and father died, an institution passed with them. As Fred Black, Jim Nichols and James Knierly (several of the hunters I brought with me to Culpiper in days passed) have said to me many times, "your parents are an institution that rarely exists any more." Such a loving and hospitable couple who entertained their guests by serving them.

I was reading in Pat Robertson's book, The Secret Kingdom. His chapter on greatness speaks of greatness as service. Jesus said, "become a servant if you wish to be truly great." Walter and Janet Hurt were two of the truly great people I have known and loved. They both possessed that secret of greatness - service. In Rotary, we have a motto, "Service Above Self." Mr. Hurt was a true Rotarian.

Yesterday, when I pondered what the hunters said about institutions, I consulted Ralph Waldo Emerson who spoke of institutions as "reflections of the men who create them,

and that "an institution is but the lengthened shadow of a man." Walter Hurt stands tall and strong in my mind today. He casts extraordinarily lengthened shadows across the many minds and hearts that have had the privilege of knowing him over the long years of his life; a life filled with love and service.

Walter Hurt believed in the teachings of Jesus Christ as a standard for living today. He believed that His teachings were not an impossible far-off dream of perfection, but workable and practical principles for conduct in the 20th. Century; and that these principles can be applied to business, to politics, and to all human relationships.

I believe that death is an important part of our human experience and is a stepping stone to more of life at its best. I believe that God has met all our needs in this world, so in life to come, He will make adequate preparation for our home-going.

Let us rejoice in His presence with us, in death as in life, among those who mourn, as with those who now see him face to face.

May God be with each one of you this day.

Item: I devise to boys, jointly, all the useful fields and commons where ball may be played, all pleasant waters where one may swim, all snowclad hills where one may

coast, and all streams and ponds where one may fish, or where, when grim Winter comes, one may skate, to hold the blossoms and butterflies thereof; the woods with their appurtenances, the squirrels and the birds and echoes and strange noises, and all distant places, which may be visited, together with the adventures there found. And I give to said boys each his own place at the fireside at night, with all pictures that may be seen in the burning wood, and to enjoy without let or hindrance or without any encumbrance or care.

Item: To Lovers, I devise their imaginary world with whatever they may need, as the stars of the sky, the red roses by the wall, the bloom of the hawthorn, the sweet strains of music and ought else they may desire to figure to each other the lastingness and beauty of their love.

Item: To young men, jointly, I devise and bequeath all the boisterous, inspiring sports of rivalry, and I give them the disdain of weakness and undaunted confidence in their own strength. Tho they are rude, I leave to them the power to make lasting friendships, and of possessing companions and to them exclusively, I give all merry songs and grave choruses to sing with lusty voices.

Item: And to those who are no longer children or youths or lovers, I leave memory; and bequeath to them the volumes of the poems of Burns and Shakespeare and of other poets, if there be others, to the end that they may live the old days over again, freely and fully without title or diminution.

Item: To our loved ones with snowy crowns, I bequeath the happiness of old age, the love and gratitude of their children until they fall asleep.

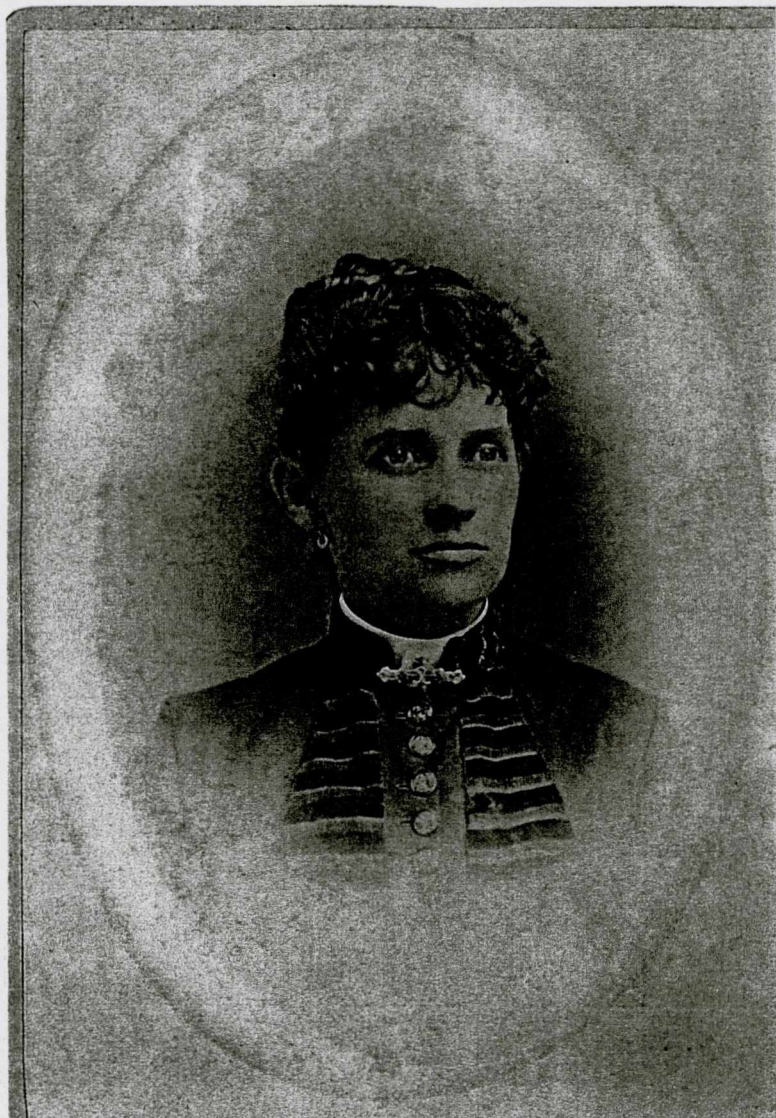

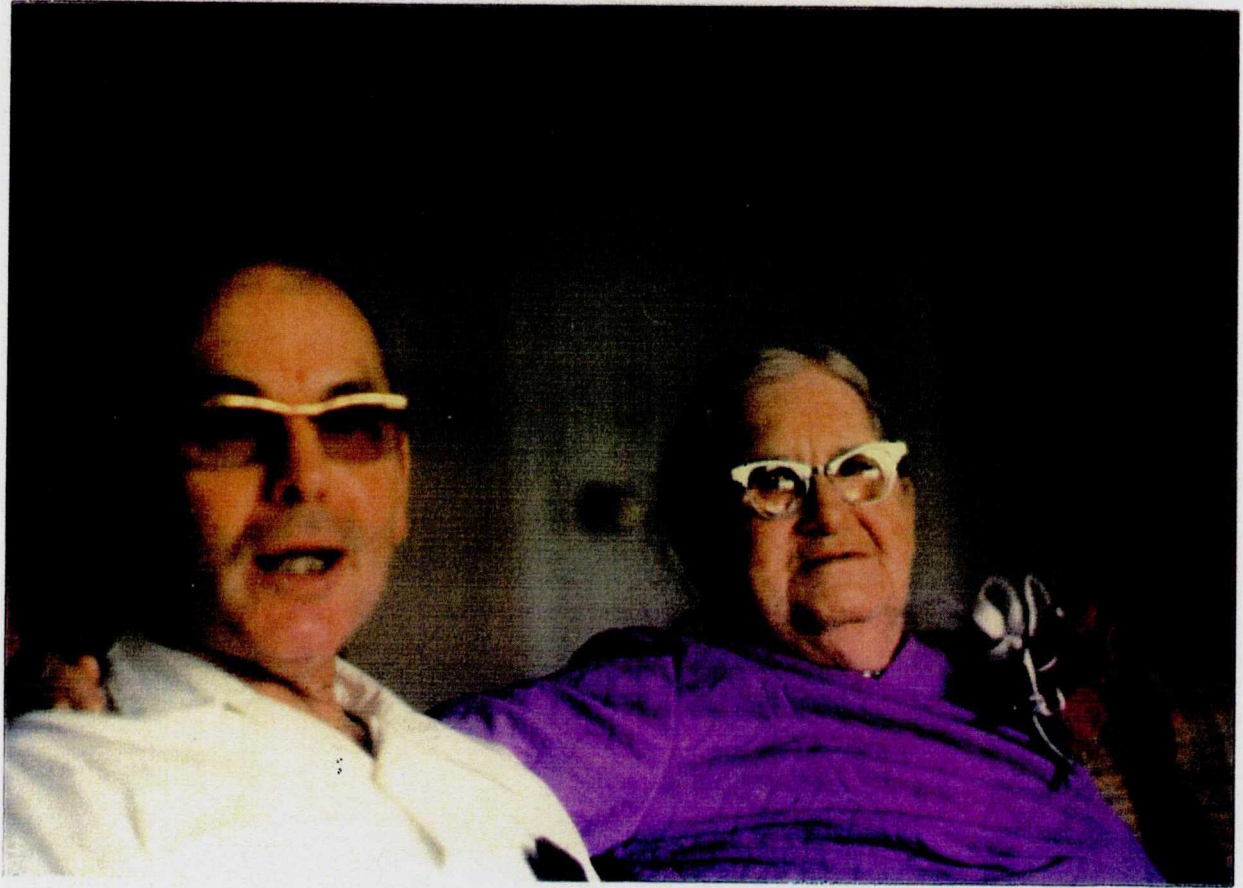

Dear Dorothy, Bolling, Daisy and Ernie,

How richly blessed one is to have a loving Christian family. When I think of Aunt Boo, so many happy memories flood my mind of her kindness, her joy, her interest in me - her example of a loving caring aunt and her love of flowers.

Her kindness: When I was in first grade, I was seven. I had been so sickly as a child that I wasn't able to attend till I was seven, and then I was allowed only to stay a half day in Mrs. Davis' class. Bolling would walk me to Macoy Avenue at his lunch time so I could nap till the older sister and brother would pick me up. She took care of me lovingly. Shd'd send me cards, birthday ones, or have some small remembrance for me in her purse as we rode home from Stevensburg Church on Sundays.

Her Joy: Aunt Boo would sing to us in the back seat of the car on way home from Sunday services. She'd sing all 6 Or 10 verses of "A Froggie Would A Wooing Go" - and laugh till she had tears in her eyes. One of my favorite short songs was:

"You are my honey, honey suckle

I am the bee.

I love to sip the honey from your sweet lips you see-

I love you dearly dearly and I want you to know

You are my honey honey suckle, I am the bee."

Then she would hug me and laugh.

Her interest in me: This interest was strongly felt by all her nieces and nephews - She taught me to be appreciative to thank others for their kindnesses. As a teen-ager, she admonished me for these lack of expressions. When in college, my girl friend and I could stay at 3212 W. Grace St. for overnights. I know Mother and Daddy knew I would be safe - and behave myself with my favorite aunt! In the summers, Mary and I would stay a week or two with her. She'd take us to Byrd Park, to the Capital - to the big stores. This was a great education for a grammar school student and country girl!

Her Example: She would tell us stories of her good life with Dr. Nalle. In later years, I understood what it was to be a single mother and raise children. I appreciated the example

she set. She'd tell us Bible stories, also stories of Grandma and Grandpa. They all helped form a value system, a definition of our "roots".

Her love of flowers: In Richmond and at Aunt Laura's she could coach and love an abundance of flowers into bloom in a small space. Many times, I remembered her carrying manure to fertilize her plants from Bel Air!

In May, I visited her. In trying to find like memories to share, she'd often say "You know my memory isn't good."

"So lets sing, Aunt Boo - I know you'll remember the old hymns."

Revive Us Again

Jesus Lover of My Soul

I Come to the Garden Alone

I Love to Tell the Story

and on we went for over an half hour. Those words of comfort, of inspiration, of challenge were firmly bedded in her mind and experiences-

Oh what a taste of glory devine - - -


Truly, I rest in the knowledge that Jesus was hers and that she is there, with Him in glory - and as her niece, her namesake, I "rise up and call her blessed".

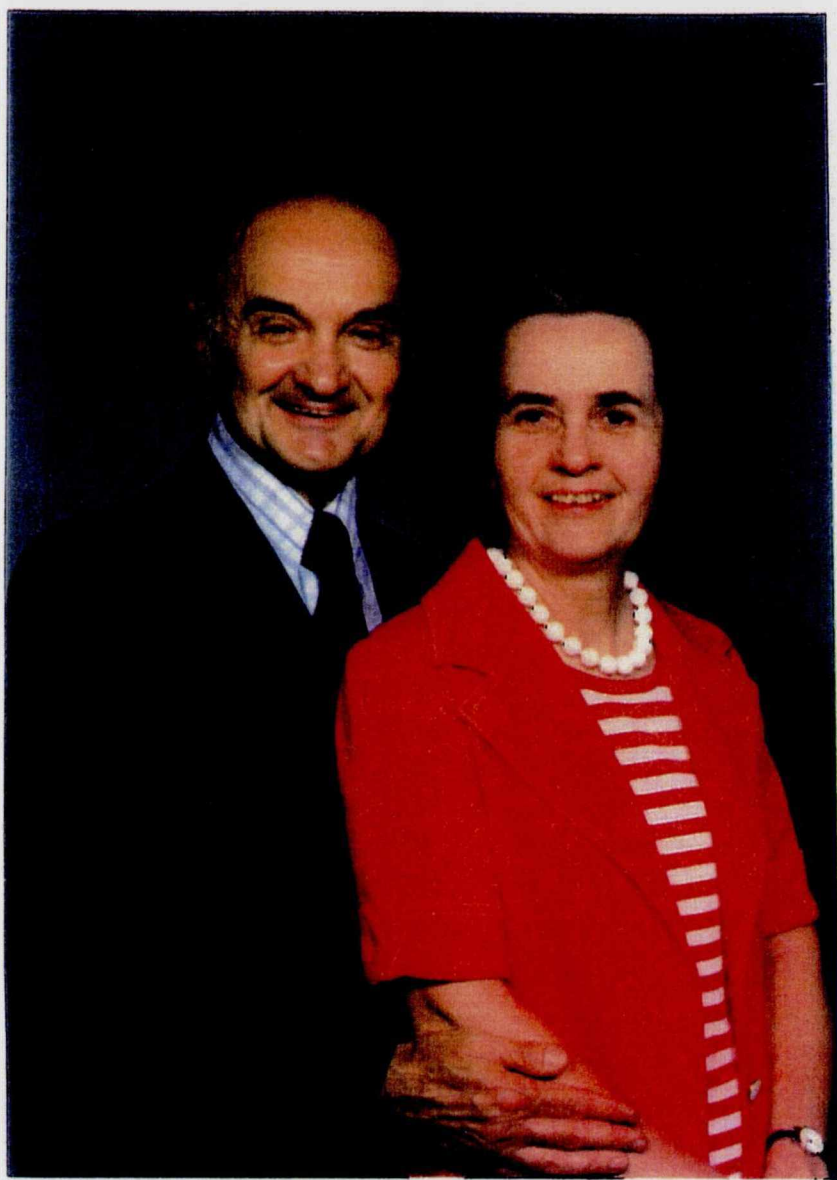

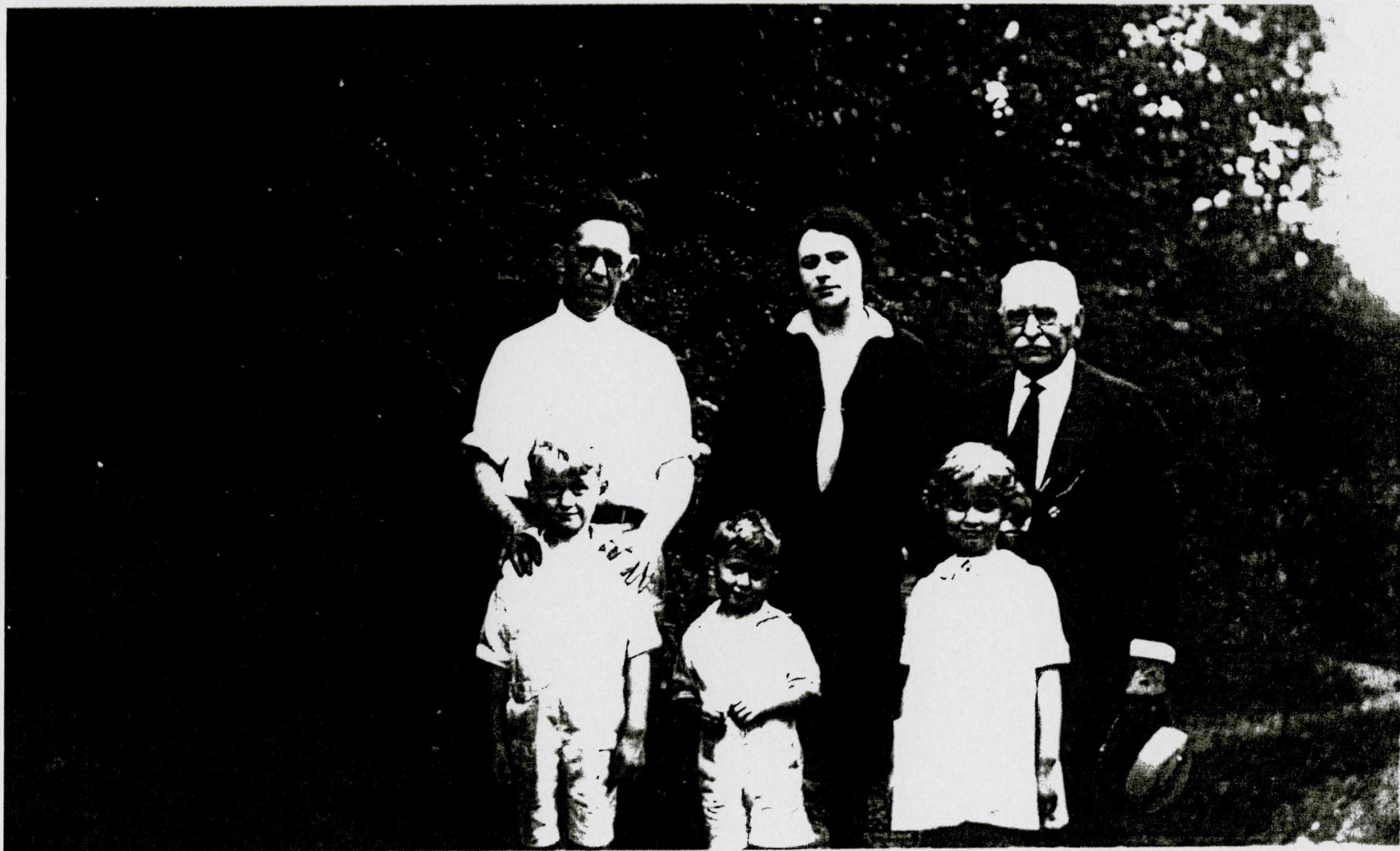

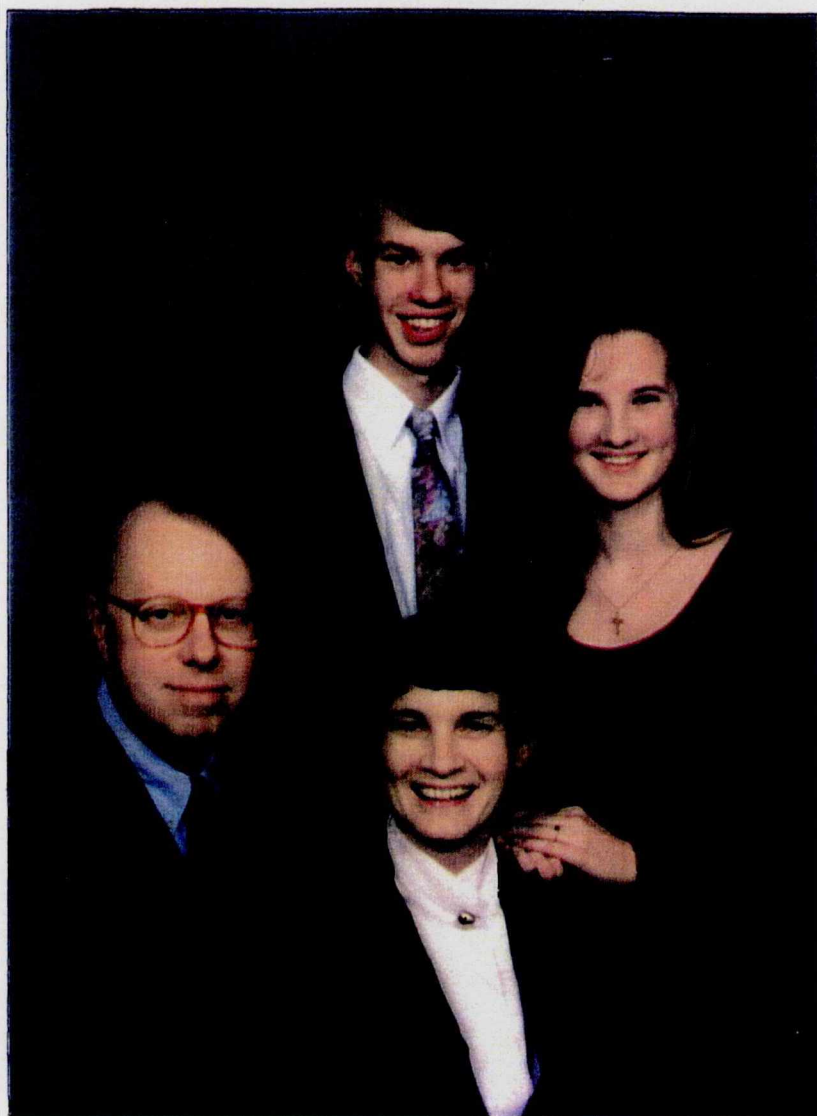
