

Memorandum of an agreement made and entered
into this day of Aug^t 1859. Between E. A.
Freeman, W. H. Browning and W. S. Humphrys,
commissioners on the part of the county Court of
Cuepeper of the one part and L. P. Nelson of
the other. Witnesseth that the said L. P. Nelson
agrees and binds himself to grade, curb and
pave the side walks around the public lot beginning
at the South East corner of J. S. Alcocks lot on which
he is now erecting a brick house, and running
thence along the present side walk to the South
East corner of the jail. The side walk from Alcock's
corner to the public pump is to be nine feet wide
and from thence to the South East corner of the jail
the width that it is from the pump to the enclosure
around the public lot. The said Nelson also agrees
to take up all the present pavement between the side
walks and clerks office, and South enclosure of
public lot except that under the arcade, and to grade
and repave the same, so as to avoid any off set between
it and the side walk. The paving is to extend to the
South East corner of the clerks office. The old bricks
from present pavement that are sound and good,
and also the old curb stones, to be used, as far
as they will go. None but good paving bricks to be used.
The sand for paving purposes is to be of good quality
and must be used in sufficient quantity.

The curbing when done to be as well done as that in
front of the square of Piedmont House. The whole work
to be under the inspection of the above named commis-
sioners, and subject to their acceptance or rejection.
The work is to be completed by the 1st of November 1859.
When the above agreement shall be fully performed
by the said L. P. Nelson on his part, and the work
received by the said commissioners on the part-
