counties were cut off from it and
so they show up in them.

told him that a Pullman ancestor was
born on the Atlantic Ocean. I think
it might have been William and

he must have been son of Edward
or Edmund as he patented land
just about 21 years after they (?)
came. I sometimes wonder if

Edmund and Edward were the
same. The dates of patents are in
one of those note books and are
in the ~~book~~ ^{series} of fifties.

get home they were left as I
told you and maybe you would
like to examine them. The note
books also contain Halladay and

Boonell date.

information for me on my mother's

to examine.
